# KEY DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS

- Population declined every decade since 1980
- SOBC population declined less than district-wide  
-27% districtwide & -23% SOBC
- Black population declined most from 2000 – 2014  
-22.5% districtwide & -21.5% SOBC
- SOBC White population increased from 2000 – 2014  
-4.2% districtwide & +5.2% SOBC
- SOBC School-aged population decline from 2000 – 2014 was **3x** more than overall SOBC population decline  
-26% school-aged children & -6.5% overall population
- SOBC has lower housing vacancy rates than district-wide  
21% districtwide & 15% SOBC

## KEY ENROLLMENT TRENDS

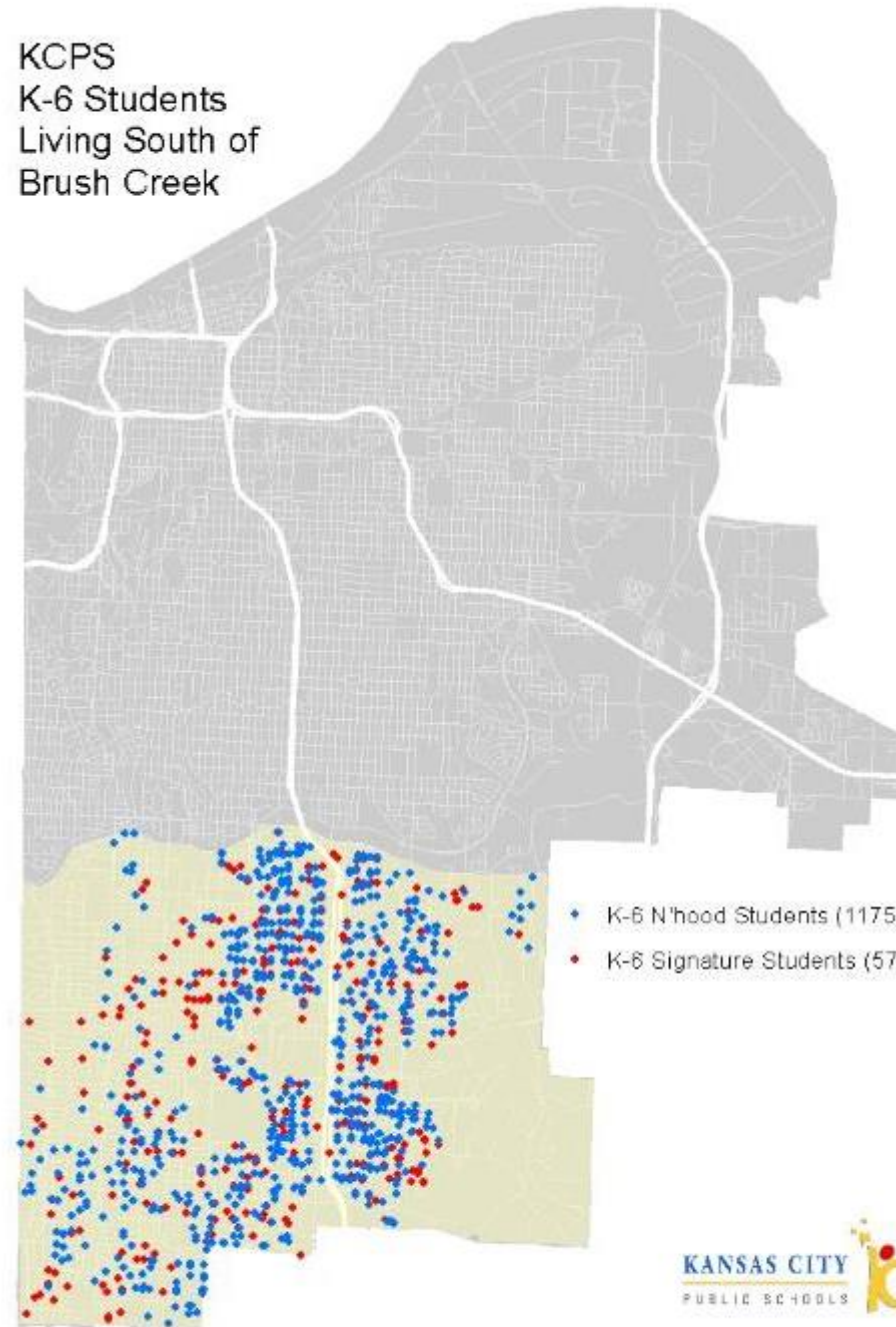
- Public school enrollment (KCPS & charters) has decreased **27%** since 1999 but has stabilized since 2010
- Charter enrollment increased **8.5%** in SY2017  
Kindergarten enrollment at charters increased **19%**
- KCPS enrollment decreased most between 4<sup>th</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grades, 6<sup>th</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup> grades & 9<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> grades (SY15 – SY17)
- Significant drops in enrollment (**-26%**) between 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade at KCPS and charter schools (SY15 – SY17)

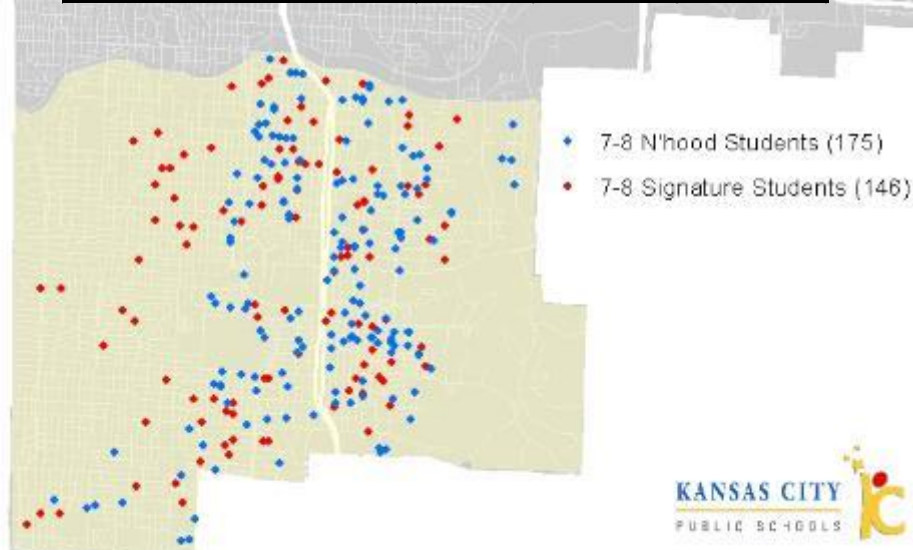

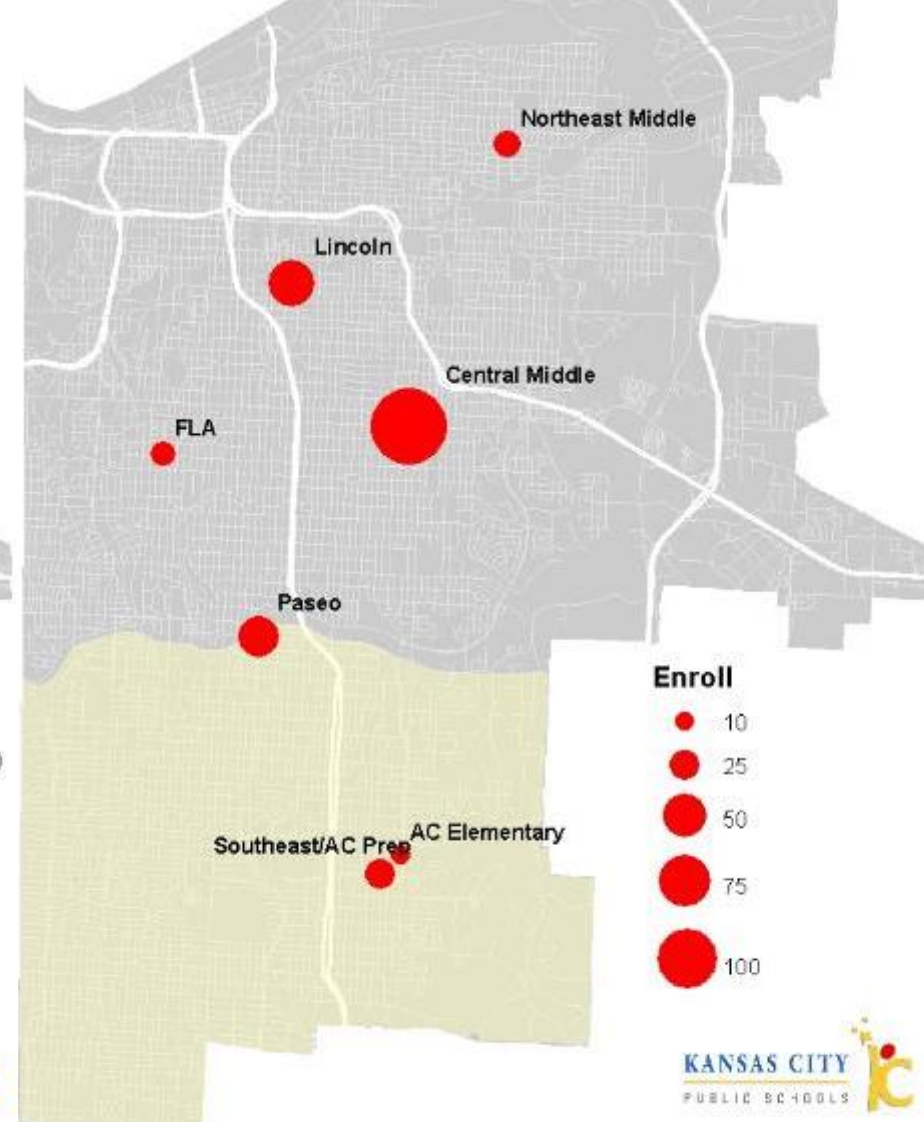

4.
